Consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office is not a substitution for consultation with Tribal Historic Preservation Offices, other Native American tribes, local governments, or the public. We have completed our review of this report and have the following comments to offer:

If the proposed project were to require federal permits, licenses, funds, loans, grants, or assistance for development, we would recommend to the federal or state agency or agencies that archaeological site 16OU418 and structures 37-02567 through 37-02580 are not eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places, and that no historic properties will be affected by this undertaking. Our office has no further concerns for this project.
